

ORDINANCE NUMBER: 2014-05

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING-A VARIANCE TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE VILLAGE OF CHERRY VALLEY, ILLINOIS, SECTION 34-62(b)(6) MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS.
(CHIEF OF POLICE)

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees for the Village of Cherry Valley, Illinois, have approved the appointment of Lawrence M. Neville as the interim Chief of Police for the Village of Cherry Valley, Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, under Section 34-62(b)(6) Minimum Qualifications. Chief of Police. Said minimum qualifications require the Chief of Police to have graduated from a four (4) year college or university with major course work in criminal justice, police science, law enforcement, or public administration or other related fields; and,

WHEREAS, the interim Chief of Police, Lawrence M. Neville, has not graduated from a four (4) year college or university as required by the minimum qualifications as set forth in the Code of Ordinances for the Village of Cherry Valley, Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, Lawrence M. Neville; however, has extensive experience in law enforcement and also operating a business and personnel matters, and the Board of Trustees for the Village of Cherry Valley, Illinois wish to appoint Lawrence M. Neville as its next Chief of Police; and,

WHEREAS, although Lawrence M. Neville does not meet the educational minimum qualification requirements as set forth by the Code of Ordinances, should the Board of Trustees appoint Lawrence M. Neville as its next Chief of Police, it is necessary to enact a variance to allow said appointment.

NOW, WHEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE VILLAGE OF CHERRY VALLEY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: A variance, shall and hereby is granted to Section 34-62(b)(6) of the Code of Ordinances for the Village of Cherry Valley, Illinois to allow the Board of Trustees to appoint Lawrence M. Neville as the Chief of Police for the Village of Cherry Valley, Illinois without meeting the minimum educational qualification requirements.

SECTION 2: This variance shall not be construed as a waiver for future appointments for the position of Chief of Police. Although, the Board of Trustees, depending upon the applicants, may waive the minimum educational qualification requirement again.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval, passage and publication in pamphlet form.
