ADOPT AGENDA: Trustee Schroeder moved to adopt the agenda. Trustee Belt seconded. All “Aye”; none opposed. Motion carried by voice vote.

APPROVE MINUTES: June 14, 2016. Trustee Belt moved to approve the minutes for June 14, 2016. Trustee Schroeder seconded. All “Aye”; none opposed. Motion carried by voice vote.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Police Chief Neville’s Request to Attend Training

Trustee Schroeder moved to send to the Village Board for approval Chief Neville’s Attendance at the 2016 Illinois Problem-Oriented Police Training to be held September 27-29, 2016 in Naperville, Illinois at a cost not to exceed \$460.00 from Line Item 5195P Training \$100.00 and 5200P Travel \$360.00. This training meets the annual requirement for Chief’s training. Trustee Belt seconded. All “Aye;” none opposed. Motion carried on voice vote.

2. July 4th Recap

Police Chief Neville reported the 4th of July event went very smoothly with only one incident of a lost child which was resolved immediately. He indicated compared to last year our police officers were able to move the traffic through and out of the Village in approximately 60 minutes. He noted only one complaint that pedestrians are a safety issue with the traffic. In response to a question from Trustee Schroeder on number of people in attendance, Chief Neville indicated he would estimate 2,000 people.

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3. Swanson Park Issues Related to the New School

Police Chief Neville noted discussion will need to take place with everyone involved prior to the school opening to make sure we are on the same page. Also to survey what areas the Police Department needs to concentrate on regarding parents dropping off their children.

Chairman Fustin provided his food for thought on the new school:

- There will be a need for yellow curb painting at intersections in Swanson Park to insure visibility for motorists.
- Paint Cross Walks at the following corners: Rydell & Swanson Park, Rydell & Kregel and Rydell & Abbingdon.
- School Speed Zone Signs.
- Traffic in Swanson Park may necessitate no parking on one side of the street during certain hours to insure two way traffic thru the subdivision.
- A conversation with the Mayor has begun regarding Rydell Drive east of Kregel regarding people pulling into the residential driveways & dropping their children off. Possibly resident only turn street.

Trustee Schroeder noted communication with the school and parents may alleviate some of these issues.

CHIEF'S REPORT:

1. Overtime/Part-time Report

Police Chief Neville indicated the department as a whole is slightly over projected costs. One additional officer now on staff will give the department a little bit of break on overtime, however, Cherry Valley Days will have an impact on the overtime budget.

ADJOURNMENT: Seeing there is no other business, Trustee Fustin moved to adjourn at 6:58 PM. Trustee Belt seconded. All "Aye"; none opposed. Motion carried by voice vote.
